


#### The Wise Owl Imprint







# Biographies

Alan Summers is the Call of the Page founder and lead tutor (www.callofthepage.org). He's also founder/editor-in-chief of Bloo Outlier Journal and the Haiku Reader anthology series. A Japan Times award-winning writer, Alan was filmed by NHK Television (Japan) for "Europe meets Japan – Alan's Haiku Journey." He is a Pushcart Prizenominated poet for haiku and haibun, and Best Small Fictions nominated for haibun. He was President of the United Haiku & Tanka Society (2017 to 2021), former General Secretary of the British Haiku Society (1998-2000), and Editor Emeritus for the multi-award-winning Red Moon Anthologies for best haikai literature (2000–2005). He resides in Chippenham, England.

Kala Ramesh is a Pushcart Prize-nominated poet, mentor, editor, and author, and renowned pioneer in the field of haikai literature in India. She is the Founder/Director of Triveni Haikai India, and the Founder/Managing Editor of haikuKATHA. She has authored three haikai books, co-edited nine international anthologies and conceptualised and curated eight haikai utsavs. In 2021 HarperCollins Publishers India brought out "the forest i know, a gathering of tanka verses" a collection that also included haiku, tanka stories, haibun, tanka doha and cherita reviewed by Alan Summers for The Wise Owl: https://www.thewiseowl.art/book-the-forest-i-know

Julie Bloss Kelsey lives in Maryland, USA. She is the current Secretary of The Haiku Foundation, USA. Her poetry collection, 'Grasping the Fading Light', won the 2021 International Women's Haiku Contest from Sable Books judged by Kala Ramesh. Julie expects to have two short-form poetry collections out this year.




